**UNC Asheville Repeat Policy:** *"If a student repeats either a failed course or a course in which he or she has received a C-, D+, D, F, or U grade, only the new quality points and semester hours of credit will be used in the calculation of the grade point average. However, if the second grade is an F, no credit is earned and both grades will be used in the calculation of the grade point average. Courses taken at other institutions cannot be used to replace a grade earned in a UNC Asheville course. A student may take advantage of this forgiveness clause for a maximum of 15 semester hours of credit. However, the student's permanent record will be a complete record of all courses attempted and the grades received for these courses..."* - UNC Asheville Catalog

### Step 2. Understand expectations.

Academic Warning is just that—a warning. It serves as a reminder that we set high standards for UNC Asheville students, and if you don't meet those standards, which include active engagement in the academic curriculum, you may not be able to continue your studies at UNC Asheville. As you go through this semester on Academic Warning, be aware of our **academic suspension policy**:

*After one semester on Academic Warning, students will be suspended if they do not meet the following standards:*

Attempted Hours (includes transfer hours)	Minimum GPA Required to Avoid Suspension
24-44	1.50
45-74	1.75
75+	2.00 (required to graduate)

### Step 3. Know how to calculate your GPA.

Multiply the quality points (QP) each of your grades is worth by the number of hours you earned for each class. Add all your quality points together and divide that number by your GPA hours. You can find the quality points assigned to each grade in the Catalog.

For example:
