

How to Use this Guide

This guide is meant to offer advice on courses to take in the first year of college in order to progress towards a degree for new students at UNC Asheville, or their advisors. Completing a degree will require completion of both the Integrative Liberal Studies (ILS) curriculum as well as major requirements set by the department you choose to declare a major in.

Please [read the general plan first](#). This has information on 100-level requirements for ILS. Then you may review the section on your intended major. Designing your first-year plan will likely consist of beginning with the recommendations under your major, and then adding any and all ILS courses that you feel comfortable taking in your first year.

Drama

- The drama major requires a set of introductory courses for majors that remain consistent within all of the concentrations that the department offers (drama, acting and directing, design and production, and theatre arts with teacher licensure).
- At the 100-level, drama requirements include: DRAM 103: Voice Production I (1), DRAM 111: Acting I (3), DRAM 121: Elements of Production I (3), and DRAM 122: Elements of Production II (3).
- These do not need to be taken in sequence, except that DRAM 121 precedes DRAM 122.
- The Drama department emphasizes the importance of beginning with drama in the first year if the student is considering a major, and recommends that they take DRAM 144: Playscript Analysis for Performance (3) in their first semester, along with either DRAM 111 or DRAM 121.
