

How to Use this Guide

This guide is meant to offer advice on courses to take in the first year of college in order to progress towards a degree for new students at UNC Asheville, or their advisors. Completing a degree will require completion of both the Integrative Liberal Studies (ILS) curriculum as well as major requirements set by the department you choose to declare a major in.

Please [read the general plan first](#). This has information on 100-level requirements for ILS. Then you may review the section on your intended major. Designing your first-year plan will likely consist of beginning with the recommendations under your major, and then adding any and all ILS courses that you feel comfortable taking in your first year.

French

- The French major requirements begin after satisfaction of language requirements through the beginning and intermediate levels.
- Students must demonstrate competency through FREN 220: Intermediate French II (3) before taking any French courses that contribute to a major in French.
- Students can test into appropriate sections, demonstrate competence through this level, or simply begin at the elementary level.
- At the 100-level, students may take FREN 110 and 120, which are elementary language instruction, or FREN 115 and 125, which are elementary instruction with a focus on reading.
- Students may not receive credit for both FREN 110 and 115, or for both FREN 120 and 125.
- At the 200-level, students must receive credit for, or test out of, FREN 210 and 220, the intermediate language courses, before pursuing major requirements which begin at FREN 300: Oral Skills (3) and FREN 310: Composition and Structural Review I (3).
