

## How to Use this Guide

This guide is meant to offer advice on courses to take in the first year of college in order to progress towards a degree for new students at UNC Asheville, or their advisors. Completing a degree will require completion of both the Integrative Liberal Studies (ILS) curriculum as well as major requirements set by the department you choose to declare a major in.

Please [read the general plan first](#). This has information on 100-level requirements for ILS. Then you may review the section on your intended major. Designing your first-year plan will likely consist of beginning with the recommendations under your major, and then adding any and all ILS courses that you feel comfortable taking in your first year.

## History

- The History program has two intro-level course sequences.
- One of these is a two-course sequence in US History, and the other is a two-course sequence in World Civilizations.
- The first is comprised of HIST 101: US History to 1865 (3) and HIST 102: US History since 1865 (3).
- The second sequence is comprised of HIST 151: World Civilizations to 1500 (3), and HIST 152: World Civilizations since 1500 (3).
- It is important to note that both sequences must be completed for a major in History.
- The sequence the student takes in their first year is mostly a matter of personal preference. Technically, neither sequence is a prerequisite for higher-level history courses, but they do lay groundwork and introductions to historical method for other courses in their respective content areas.
