

How to Use this Guide

This guide is meant to offer advice on courses to take in the first year of college in order to progress towards a degree for new students at UNC Asheville, or their advisors. Completing a degree will require completion of both the Integrative Liberal Studies (ILS) curriculum as well as major requirements set by the department you choose to declare a major in.

Please [read the general plan first](#). This has information on 100-level requirements for ILS. Then you may review the section on your intended major. Designing your first-year plan will likely consist of beginning with the recommendations under your major, and then adding any and all ILS courses that you feel comfortable taking in your first year.

Management/Accounting/Industrial & Engineering Management

- The majors in Management and Accounting have similar requirements at the first-year level.
- Both require STAT 185: Introductory Statistics (4), which also covers the ILS 4-hour mathematics requirement.
- They also require a series of Economics courses, comprised of ECON 101: Principles of Macroeconomics (3), ECON 102: Principles of Microeconomics (3), ECON 306: Managerial Finance (3). It is important to note that ECON 101 and 102 do not have to be taken in any particular order.
- Both majors share a core of study within Management and Accounting that begins with ACCT 215: Principles of Accounting I (3).
- MGMT 220: Foundations of Management (3) is **not** a major requirement. It is an introductory survey course that helps students understand the discipline of management. It has LANG 120 as a pre or co-requisite, and can be taken in the first year. It is required for the Management minor.
- Students majoring in Management and Accounting should take ACCT 330: Accounting Applications (3) in their first semester to prepare them for using business software.
