Latin Education at UNCA

The goal of the UNCA licensure program in Latin, 9-12 is to prepare teachers who possess the knowledge, skills, and values included in the goals of the Education Department and applied to the teaching of Latin. Graduates of this program will have communicative competency and a depth of knowledge in Latin culture, language, and language acquisition. In addition they will be able to teach Latin resourcefully and effectively to diverse learners in grades 9-12.

There are two components to this program:

- Bachelor of Arts in Classics (Latin) at UNCA (or its equivalent if transfer or post-baccalaureate);
- Completion of the Education and Psychology sequence of courses outlined in this brochure, and all other Education Department requirements, in accordance with the Policy and Procedures Manual and current UNCA catalog.

Formal Admission to Teacher Education Program

In order to be formally admitted to the UNCA Teacher Education Program, students must

- have earned a 2.5 cumulative grade point average from UNCA or graduating institution.
- have achieved a grade of "C-" or better in Education 310/311 and other Education courses.
- have received acceptable scores as established by the NCDPI on the Praxis I Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST).
- have satisfactory evaluations on disposition checklists and on each of the abilities/characteristics listed on the Department's Requirements for Licensure contract.

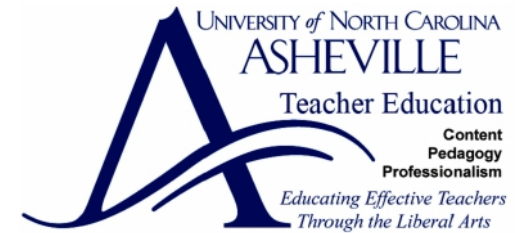
