Note on Research: Wikipedia is NOT a legitimate SINGLE research source, though it may be used to guide you to more specific sources. Unless you possess complete prior knowledge on the subject you're writing about, you will need to employ research, and if you employ research, it must be correctly annotated.

You will be required to attend and report on in 2-5 pages FOUR cultural events. Details in class and in large lectures.
