

Student Type	Eligible
Undergraduate Degree Seeking	This is an eligible student type. In order to receive Federal Title IV funding the student must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Eligibility is determined by the US Department of Education guidelines, the State of North Carolina and UNC Asheville. Student must also be making Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). Please consult the University catalog for current information on "Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy for Financial Aid Recipients." (Other restrictions may apply regarding your "Student Type" please contact your Campus Financial Aid Administrator to confirm program eligibility.)
Undeclared	Federal Regulations require every degree-seeking student to declare a major by his/her third year of college attendance. As a result University Policy states that every student must declare a major upon earning 60 credit hours in order to continue receiving Federal Title IV Aid. If you have earned 60 credit hours or more you will not be eligible to receive and/or continue to receive any Title IV funding until a major is declared. Some students may complete an "Intent of Declaration of Major" (http://www.unca.edu/sites/default/files/1112%20MAJR.pdf form) if they need to complete specific institutional and departmental prerequisites for declaring a major; however, this form is specifically designed to extend Title IV benefits for up to one (1) additional semester at that point a student must make a declaration in order to receive and/or continue receiving Title IV aid. Distance Learning and Study Abroad	This is an eligible student type; however other restrictions may apply regarding your "Student Type" please contact your Campus Financial Aid Administrator to confirm program eligibility. Distance education programs at domestic schools are considered eligible FSA programs. The program must be required for your degree program and you must earn credit hours from your home school. Distance education means education that uses certain technologies to deliver instruction to students who are separated from the instructor, and to support regular and substantive interaction between the students and the instructor. The interaction may be synchronous (student and instructor are in communication at the same time) or asynchronous. The technologies may include <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the internet, • audio conferencing, or • one-way and two-way transmissions through open broadcast, closed circuit, cable, microwave, broadband lines, fiber optics, satellite, or wireless communications devices. A course taught through video cassettes or discs is also considered a distance education course, but only if one of the three technologies listed above is used to support interaction between the students and the instructor.
Graduate (MLA Non-Degree)	This is an ineligible student type.
Graduate (MLA Degree)	This is an eligible student type. In order to receive Federal Title IV funding the student must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
